If you are like me you may not read your messages. BBO has just announced and upgrade to BBO whereby they have moved the Casual Main Bridge Club and Relaxed Bridge Club to a new server. As a result you may not see some of your friends online. This is especially important if you are setting up a game to play with friends. Please read the below for what to do.

The html version of BBO has just been updated and and it comes with a major architecture change.

In order to help expand the site and accommodate more players, all playing options available in the Casual menu have been moved to a second BBO server.

What does this mean?

- Every time you click on Casual you will be smoothly moved to another server. You will notice a "connecting…" pop-up on your screen every time you switch between Casual and the rest of the site.
- When this happens, you won't have to login again. You will be able to continue to use the site as you would normally do.
- You might notice some unusual things, as detailed below. Consider the CASUAL button an entry point allowing you to switch between BBO sites. If something's strange, click CASUAL and see if that fixes.

This is a work in progress, that required deep architectural changes to the site. You might notice unusual behaviours, such as:

- When you are playing in the Casual area, you will not see players connected to the main BBO server, and vice versa. This means someone playing an ACBL tournament for example will not see in the list of online players his friend who is playing in the Main Bridge Club.
- When you are playing in the Casual area you will not be automatically taken to your tournament, if you are registered for an upcoming game. So if you register for a Speedball and want to

play a few hands in Main Club until it starts, you might miss your game. Remember to switch back to the Competitive area with a few minutes before your tournament is scheduled to start.

• If you are trying to start a set game with your friends, ask them to click the Casual button before sending them invitations to join your table. If you are in Casual and they are on the main BBO site, they will not receive your invitations.

BBO's technical team worked hard to provide an immediate solution to the massive influx of new bridge players who needed a new home. We are aware there are improvements to be made, and we continue to focus on providing a seamless experience to our users.

Meanwhile we thank you for your understanding and we'll do our best to complete the two BBO servers integration as fast as possible.

Visit www.bridgebase.com and click Login/Register to give it a try. And remember, you can use your favorite device to log in — the html version is compatible with mobile devices too.

Subject: Are you interested in playing with and against other club members?

ACBL is working on clubs being able to setup online games. In the meantime I have an Idea on how to set up tables for our members to play with and against each other. We can play in either the Relaxed Bridge Club or the Main Bridge Club. You don't get any MP but it's free. This is how it might work.

- We set a start time say 1:00 pm (our normal club start time) but logon 5-10 minutes early.
- People sign up by email as partners (easiest). You can use our partnership google group to find a partner just as you would for a regular club game.
- Based on the number that signup we would have one person at each table act as host (N/S) and start their table. The table would be by invitation only so spots are reserved for all 4 players. Instructions will be provided.

To our valued Club members re: COVID-19 and temporary suspension of play at the Club Effective immediately

It is with a mixture of sadness and hope that you are receiving this message. We are saddened that you will no longer at this time be able to enjoy a game of bridge at the club due to the spread of the Covid 19 virus, and hopeful that if we obey our social conscience, we will help "flatten the curve" and slow the spread of the virus.

After great deliberation, the Board of Directors has voted to close the club effective immediately. The virus is expected to be around for a long time, but we will re evaluate the situation after two weeks and weekly thereafter, and follow the directives of our Public Health Department who has a grip on the bigger picture. We will keep you advised of the progress of the disease spread.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT GAMES - THE ROOKIE-MASTER GAMES

We ask that masters at all tables sit in the same direction (i.e. North and East).

We feel that it will add fairness and consistency to have masters sitting in the same position as other masters.

Note: There are some pairs playing where there is really not a "master" (under 200 mps) so this would not apply to them.

Also, there may be a reason that a master would not like to sit North (for example, not wanting to be in charge of scoring). In that case, the person sitting south or west, for example, could do the scoring.

CELL PHONES - CLARIFYING OUR POLICY

- a) All cell phones are to be turned off or put on vibrating mode prior to the start of all bridge games.
- b) The director will issue only one reminder or warning regarding this policy during any given game.
- c) After a reminder has been given, if a person's phone rings during the game a quarter board penalty will be given. Since bridge is a partnership game, the penalty applies to the final score of the pair.
- d) Talking on a cell phone at the table while the game is on will result in the same penalty.
- e) In order that players might be reached should the need arise, players should give the Club phone number as the number at which they can be reached.
- f) An exception would be made for anyone on call, or who advised the director in advance that they are awaiting an important call. These individuals should still be encouraged to set their phone on vibrate mode.

HANDICAP PARKING AT BACK

Remember that there are 4 parking spots available at the back of the building for our use: Two are designated as handicap spots and can be used by anyone with a handicap permit. Two others are specifically designated as RDBC parking (we ask that these also be used by people requiring handicap parking).

- Directors will endeavour to have someone checking the back door in case there are players requiring entry.
- If you have a cell phone, you can also call the Club once you are parked, and someone will let you in.
- If your pard is already at the Club, ask them to make sure you get into the building.
- *Special note: Doors lock behind you. If you let someone in the outside door, be sure that the inside door has not closed behind you, which would lock you between doors.

This can happen, as one of our members can attest (won't mention your name, G.Mc.!)
