The best games in October were Cal McLeod and Dow Cooney with 73.81% in an open game and Joyce Butler and Edie Laidlaw with 65.28% in a restricted game. In November Cal and Dow were tops again with a wonderful 76.19% and Pat Harlton and Kathy Bryden had 66.07% in the restricted category.

There is also sad news to report. Long time member Bob Stewart died suddenly in early November. We will miss hearing his delightful Scottish accent at the table.

We currently have four hard-working directors at the club and three who are on leave at the moment, but we need more so we can consider offering more games or providing substitutes if people are away or ill. If you think you would like to learn to direct, we would love to hear from you. Please talk to any director or member of the club executive if you are interested in helping the club in this way.

We also need more players to come out for our Tuesday evening open game. This is the only chance for working players with over 100 points to play with their regular partners. We need at least eight players to hold a game, and more make for better competition.

The club in partnership with Unit 573 is planning to offer an online game hopefully starting in January 2022. This will have two sections, open and under 300 points, and will be on Sunday afternoons. Players from other Saskatchewan clubs will be able to participate in this, so there will be more competition. We will send out more details in January.

The schedule for December includes the Art Dahl championship in the afternoon on December 13. There will be no game on December 24.

Although the current Covid-19 public health restrictions have prevented us from hosting a Christmas gathering and game this year, the club executive certainly wants to wish all of you merry Christmas and all the best of health and happiness for 2022.

NOTICE TO MEMBERS OF THE REGINA DUPLICATE BRIDGE CLUB

These premises are classified as a public, non-essential business. Therefore, in keeping with the Saskatchewan Provincial Government mandate, everyone is required to wear a close-fitting mask that covers their mouth and nose.

Subject: Reopening

RDBC Re-opening, August 2, 2021

Exciting news! The club will open for the first post pandemic game on Family Day, August 2, 2021 for an open game. The format for all games will be according to our regular schedule unless otherwise noted. We welcome all fully vaccinated players of all levels of expertise. Masks will be optional, but because of the close proximity at the tables, you may choose to wear one. There should be no judging of people's individual choices.

At this time there will be no coffee available but each player is welcome to bring one water bottle or beverage container for their own personal use. No food products will be allowed in the beginning. We have set the tables at the recommended distance and have made provisions for shared sanitizing before each game. If anyone wishes to sanitize their chairs and/or table more often they are welcome to do so. The boards and bidding boxes will also be sanitized before the game. We will have extra bidding boxes available. If anyone feels more comfortable having their own, they can label the box and leave it at the club for their exclusive use.

Hand sanitizer will be available the directors' desk to use when you arrive and also at the tables. We encourage everyone to use it frequently but caution you to make sure your hands are dry before handling the cards, because the residue tends to gum up the dealing machine.

The major change you will notice is that we are going CASHLESS. There will be no exchange of money. We have acquired a Point of Sale machine which you will recognize as a debit or credit machine that you use most everywhere. It will accept all common credit, debit, and bank cards. On your first day back, you will be required to pay your \$25 registration fee for 2021-2022. (You will remember we waved the fee for 2020-2021.) This will allow you to play any or all games the first week free of charge.

We will be selling game punch cards at 10 games for \$70. You can also pay for individual games, but we encourage you to purchase multiple game cards on a debit card because each transaction is at a cost to the club. A debit transaction costs 10 cents and a credit transaction costs 2.6 % plus 10 cents. Thus, a multiple punch card of \$70 on a debit card is only a 10 cent cost while the same transaction on a credit card is \$1.92. Everyone has a bank card and those usually double as a debit card. For sanitary reasons and ease of use we will encourage you to use a touchless method. If you have questions or concerns please approach any member of the Board Of Directors.

Please join us as we get back in the groove. To begin August 2 week we will offer

Monday 1 pm - open game

Monday 7 pm – under 100 points

Tuesday 1 pm – under 1000 points

Thursday 1 pm - under 1500 points

Friday 1 pm – open game

Note that the second week we will have an open Tuesday evening game if players indicate to the directors that they have interest in playing. We will try to add an additional game each week, if the members show interest, until we are back to our full complement of games.

Finally, we would like to express our thanks to the Saskatoon Bridge Club for inviting our members to join their online BBO games during the Covid19 shutdown. We are grateful to have been included and appreciate their generosity in returning a portion of the fees to us. We also appreciate the RealBridge initiated and co-sponsored by the Unit, and most capably directed by Joyce and Claire on Monday evenings.

The Financial statement is attached and is self explanatory. You will note that the rent for the first 5 months is 25% due to tenant grants, and then reverts to the full amount as we did not qualify for business grants. The grants received explain the significant difference year over year for rent. Considering the seriousness and duration of the pandemic, we are very grateful to have had a substantial saving and other than spending some of that money, we have escaped unscathed. Note that the miscellaneous income indicated under Receipts is a return from Saskatoon Bridge Club for fees our members paid to play in their online games, and that the directors' fees under Game Management were in support of RealBridge.

If you agree with the Nominated Board of Directors and find the Financial Report acceptable, DO NOTHING. This action will register your positive vote.

Here's the good news. The board met this weekend and we have designated Monday, August 2, 2021 as our reopening date, provided that we can abide by SHA and government guidelines and regulations. We will open on a gradual scale starting with 5 games the first week and gradually adding games as attendance increases. Protocol details will be established and published as opening day nears.

You will be required to purchase a new membership, and by doing so in the first week, you will be entitled to play free bridge for the opening week. We are attempting to have a game for everyone.
